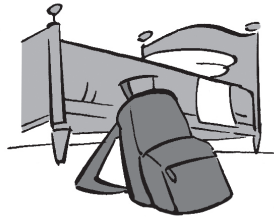

Street Foods from the World

If you haven't got a lot of money, street food is a great way to eat well. In Europe, Africa, Asia... all over the world there are street stalls with ready-to-eat foods and drinks. Street food is cheap, fast and delicious! Here are a few examples.

Falafel

These small fried balls are very common in Israel, North Africa and Turkey. What's in them? Chickpeas, garlic and spices. They are served with pitta (a special bread), onion rings and vegetables.

Crêpes

This is a traditional French dish and is very easy to make. The ingredients are flour, eggs, milk, butter and salt. There are two types of crêpes, sweet and savoury, and they have different fillings: Nutella, sugar, lemon juice, cream, or ham, cheese, bacon...

Doner Kebab

Doner Kebab is of Turkish origins but is very popular in all of Europe today. It is made from roasted meat – beef, lamb, chicken, but not pork, as Turkey is a Muslim country! It is served in pitta bread with salad, chips and a spicy sauce like mint yoghurt or garlic mayonnaise.

Spring rolls

Spring rolls street stalls are all over Asia. This traditional Chinese dish is very old but today there are lots of variations in the type of filling. For example, in the filling there is cabbage or carrots, meat, fish, or tofu. Spring rolls are served with soy sauce.

Samosa

Like spring rolls, samosa are small fried snacks with a savoury filling of vegetables or meat, but samosa are triangular in shape and, like many Indian foods, very spicy! They are served with chutney, an Indian sauce.
